GROW SUSTAINABLE TEAMS TO LEAD FAMILY ENGAGEMENT EFFORTS AT YOUR SCHOOL OR DISTRICT



Creating sustainable systems of change in family engagement can be challenging! Where do schools and districts begin? Let our team of family engagement experts guide you through developed practices and procedures to establish Family Engagement Leadership teams.

These teams, comprised of school administrators, educators, and family members, will learn together through embedded family engagement professional development. They will work together in shared partnership to grow their own personalized Family Engagement plans and create systems of accountability that will work within the school to meet the needs of students, educators, and families.

Family Voice

BRING STUDENTS AND FAMILIES TOGETHER FOR INTENTIONAL DIALOGUE ON SCHOOL SUCCESS

Family Voice aims to establish long-term relationships and school traditions that bring family and community voices to the table and, in return, promote a sense of belonging, shared responsibility, and student success.

Partner with our team to enhance authentic two-way communication between families and schools in organic and safe settings using the Appreciate Inquiry research model. School teams can better meet the needs of students and families based upon analysis of qualitative data compiled during family, community, and student focus groups.

FAMILY FOCUS GROUPS

Our team helps facilitate discussion on topics such as belonging, student social-emotional needs, academic achievement, transitioning between grades, family engagement, and more.

COMMUNITY FOCUS GROUPS

We facilitate community focus groups within local spaces. The discussion focuses on topics the school or district wants to learn more about from a community stakeholder perspective.

STUDENT FOCUS GROUPS

Our team creates safe spaces for students of all ages to vocalize their school experiences, leading to a better understanding of school or district needs and ideas to address those needs.

FAMILY & COMMUNITY SURVEYS

Surveys are a great way to get a "pulse-check" on what stakeholders think or feel about something. We can help you develop questions, create the survey, distribute, and compile results.

SCHOOL MORE INVITING TO FAMILIES AND THE COMMUNITY

The Family Friendly Walk-Through (FFWT) process is a research-based model, where school teams reflect on and rate the school's family engagement practices to identify what is working well and opportunities for growth. The team utilized educator and family surveys and a school walk-through to gather data. Our team facilitates conversations and compiles data into a detailed report. Schools can continue the process with a data retreat for action planning and add coaching and assistance to track these changes.





Title I Family Engagement Planning and Consultation

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR FEDERAL DOLLARS TO ENGAGE FAMILIES IN AUTHENTIC AND MEANINGFUL WAYS

Title I is federal funding that is included in the/required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Its goal is to provide all students significant opportunities for fair, equitable, and high-quality education to close educational gaps. Title I schools are required to conduct outreach to all school families and implement programs, activities, and policies for the involvement of families in their students' education.



OUR TEAM CAN HELP YOU MEET THESE FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Developing Parent and Family Engagement Policies, both at the district and school level
- Budgeting funds to support schools with Parent and Family Engagement requirements
- Developing a shared responsibility for a School-Parent Compact
- Building capacity for family involvement
- Providing access to parents and family members to partner

Our services include writing and facilitating Family and Community Engagement Plans, budget assistance, and development of accountability systems for Title I programming at the school and district level.

Family Engagement Workshops

Early Childhood Workshops

Poverty Escape Room

The Poverty Escape Room isn't a traditional simulation or workshop. In this hands-on learning environment, participants will experience a simulated day in the life of an individual who lives in poverty. While we all know that you simply cannot "escape" poverty, the goal is to bring awareness to how poverty impacts the students and families we work with and to begin constructive conversations around poverty.


Participants will experience firsthand the barriers those living in poverty navigate daily through a true story based on a South Dakotan's lived experiences. Our team will then facilitate a discussion and provide information about our community and the epidemic of poverty.

Having a healthy school or organizational environment is essential, not only for staff members, but also for students, families, and key stakeholders. The DISC Assessment is a tool to gain personalized insight into your team members which can be used to develop skills in communication, efficacy, and teamwork

From the assessment, our specialists will engage leaders in critical analysis of the varying "types" of people on their team and use that data to develop an action plan. We will work with school or organization leaders to plan activities that will lead team members to deeper understanding on who they are as teammates, how they communicate, and where they place value for their work.

The South Dakota Statewide Family Engagement Center (SFEC) unites students, families, schools, and communities together by focusing on learner needs from "cradle to career." SFEC strives to ensure that all learners—especially English Language Learners, economically disadvantaged learners, and minority students—have the support they need to achieve academic, career, and life goals.

SFEC is possible through various statewide partnerships.





What happens before and after school and during the summer can have a huge impact on the learning and development of South Dakota youth. Path2Impact is a project funded with federal dollars available to the South Dakota Department of Education through the American Rescue Plan (ARP) to support out-of-school time (OST) programs in the areas of leadership, professional development, curriculum content, staff onboarding, and more.





The 21st Century Discovery Programs enhance a student's normal learning opportunities everyday after school and during the summer. The programs immerse students in project-based STEM, reading, art, health, and social-emotional learning activities they can use outside of the school walls. The programs not only provide a safe and secure setting for children, but also give students the opportunity to belong to something bigger than just themselves—a stepping stone to becoming upstanding citizens.





Families First Home Visiting (FFHV) empowers families in rural communities to provide their children with the best possible start in life through evidence-based, parent-focused home visiting.

Families First provides home visiting for families with children birth to six who don't receive home visiting services from another program. Home educators support parents in building nurturing relationships, promoting optimal development, and achieving their family goals.
